Juniors Class: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty"

Scripture References:

Rev. 4:8; Is. 6:3

Story Summary:

Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty" (Rev.

4:8; note Is. 6:3).

- Hannah recognized that "There is none holy like the Lord" (I Sam. 2:2).
- God's holiness separates Him from all others: "To whom then will you compare me, that I should be like Him? says the Holy One" (Is. 40:25).
- God's eyes are too pure to look on evil (Hab. 1:13).
- The Old Testament emphasizes God's holiness. The tabernacle and temple with the holy and most holy places (Ex. 26:33; I Kings 6:16, 19), the offerings (Lev. 1-7), the priesthood in its function as a mediator (Lev. 8-10), the laws about impurity (Lev. 11-15), (etc.) all exhibit God's holiness.
