Learning to be Holy

Words of Encouragement by Linda Hull on February 23, 2011

As a Sunday School teacher, I like to make opportunities to give them a chance to tell me about what they know about the Bible. In this instance we were discussing how we misuse our tongue, based on James 3. The answers were flying fast and furious: lying, cursing, being unkind, tattling, and gossiping. These were great answers from an elementary age group that hadn't read the Scripture verses yet. In James 3, the author teaches how small things can rule over us. He tells of the rudder on a ship being a small object, yet it controls a huge ship. Then there is the bit that is placed in a horse's mouth to maintain control and give the horse necessary directions. Last, James describes the tongue as a "little member" that boasts great things. He likens the tongue to a fire in verse 6: "And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity: so is the tongue among our members, that it defilet the whole body, and setteth on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire of hell." (KJV) Clearly the tongue can cause a lot of trouble.

The children took it all in, but they weren't personalizing it to themselves. They all agreed they were guilty of these things. We adults do that too. We read the Bible and take it all in, even agreeing with the concepts, but we forget to put into practice what we read.

I struggled to help the children make sense of what we had read together. First I admitted my failings with the tongue. Being transparent and relevant gave them courage to admit their failures as well. Before long one boy commented that he had music on his iPod that contained cursing. I tried not to show my joy! Cursing is awful, but an admission of guilt was exciting because it meant he was getting the concept.

Teaching moments are a gift from God, so I leaped in by asking, "What are you going to do about it?" He looked so shocked.

"Do?"

"Yes. What can you do about the cursing?" "Well, I can't delete them. They cost me money," he said. "Does God like cursing?" I asked.

"No."

Now it was time to challenge all of them to choose to please God or themselves. I asked them, "Which do you love more, God or your music?"

Silence reigned. There was much for them to think about.

Adults struggle with these things too. We are not immune to fighting the desires of the flesh against our desire to be holy. The Apostle Peter tells us about holiness in 1 Peter 1:13-16 "Wherefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and hope to the end for the grace that is to be brought unto you at the revelation of Jesus Christ; as obedient children, not fashioning yourselves according to the former lusts in your ignorance: but as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation; because it is written, be ye holy; for I am holy."

The natural man wants the world's offerings, naturally. When we accept Jesus as our Savior, we must turn away from the lusts of the flesh. We must love Him more. Learning to be holy is a lifelong battle that we must wage before our children as good examples, so that they too will choose holiness.
