And ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars: see that ye be not troubled: for all [these things] must come to pass, but the end is not yet.

What is the difference between Veteran's Day and Memorial Day?

War is a very sad time but we know that there will always be wars as long as this world stands. Why? People! They just can't get along for so many reasons. You would likely lose count of the different reasons for war if you tried to count all the reasons we have them.

Veterans Day is an official United States holiday which honors people who have served in armed service also known as *veterans*. It is a federal holiday that is observed on November 11.

The forerunner of Veterans Day was Armistice Day, proclaimed by U.S. President Woodrow Wilson for November 11, 1919, to honor those members of the armed forces who were killed during World War I. Armistice is a pause in fighting brought about by an agreement between the two sides.

The date of 11th November was chosen to commemorate the armistice signed between the Allies of World War I and Germany at Compiègne, France, for the ceasing of action of hostilities on the Western Front of World War I. An Act was approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday, a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day."

In 1954, after World War II and after American forces had fought aggression in Korea the Congress amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans." With the approval of the legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11 th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

Don't confuse Veterans Day and Memorial Day. Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans, while Memorial Day is a day of remembering the men and women who died while serving.

We should remember they all served and fought. Some came home and some didn't. If our hearts are in the right place, we should show respect to all who served. If you don't have feelings for them, take a trip down to the Veteran's Hospital, to see the ones with no arms or legs, or faces disfigured, or visit the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, or the National Cemeteries when the families take a flag and place on the grave of their loved one. If that doesn't touch, you can't be touched.

Tomorrow on November 11 th., shake the hand of a person you know that served in the U.S. Military and let them know you appreciate them. We have some in our church that fits that description. Let's have them stand today in church and give them a big thank you hand clap!

Then say a prayer for all those that didn't make it home!
